Stirrings From Susan

"So, when we preach that Christ was crucified, the Jews are offended and the Greeks say it's all nonsense. But to those called by God to salvation, both the Jews and the Gentiles, Christ is the power of God and the wisdom of God. This foolish plan of God is wiser than the wisest of human plans, and God's weakness is stronger than the greatest of human strength." – I Corinthians 1:23-24

The early church did not dismiss the teaching and ministry of Jesus, but in the cross, they were confronted by a plan that didn't make sense to anyone! As they struggled to piece together the meaning of the cross, they discovered a spiritual paradox – the way to life is through death.

The season of Lent is a 40-day journey with Jesus' disciples to the cross. We begin with the Transfiguration of Jesus and his Temptation in the Wilderness

and arrive abruptly, unexpectedly at the cross. What does this have to do with a loving God? Why would a loving Parent subject their beloved to suffering and death? What is the meaning of the cross for our Christian faith? These are the challenging questions that Lent raises for people of faith. And for these answers, we must struggle. There is no easy 'answer' that satisfies us.

But God's passion in Jesus riles the powers that be, unsettles the status quo, stirs life in the midst of the world's death -dealing, misery-making, selling-intobondage strongholds. It threatens to set people free for real abundance and evil and power and greed want nothing of that

Lent traditionally was the time in the Church when catechists would gather for 40-days of in-depth training for the new life that followed baptism. On Easter Sunday, they would be baptized, buried with Christ, and raised to a new life in Christ. This was no other-worldly life, but a call to live a life free and abundant in the midst of despair, hopelessness and suffering. This was a call to live a life of LOVE in the face of fear and struggle.

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, when corporately we gather to face our mortality, and to repent, turning again towards God. Symbolically, we receive the sign of the cross upon our foreheads, with ash.

We will be studying passages from Luke's Gospel – setting the context within the first century and developing the context for 'what does it mean to us today?' There will be lots of opportunities for us to get to know each other's faith questions, struggles and insights. There will be a freewill offering taken for the meal. You do not need to attend every gathering in order to take something for your own reflection and nourishment during Lent! The times rotate to accommodate those who work outside the home. Invite a friend to join you as well.

Did You Know...

...that Trinity, despite officially organized in 1871 as Evangelical Lutheran Trinity Church of Brookfield, did not join any national denominational organization until 1911? As I noted in a previous Bells article, the German immigrants that came to the American Midwest, resisted the strict and authoritarian controls they experienced in Germany, and instead, they exercised their religious freedom in America and followed a course of separatism. Rev. Gottlieb Thiele, a German speaking pastor from the Wisconsin Lutheran Synod, served Trinity in 1883 and 1884. After Rev. Thiele left Trinity, the congregation asked the German Evangelical Synod of North America for a new pastor. The Trinity congregation decided, in November 1884, to remove the name "Lutheran" from the name of the church. Trinity joined the Evangelical Synod of North America in 1911, and Evangelical continued to appear in Trinity's name until 1961 when it was changed to Trinity United Church of Christ.

The membership of the congregation increased steadily in the first years, although the problems of membership, church dues and entrance fees for membership were matters of much concern to the congregation. At one time, only those who owned land could be members. This was discontinued in 1884. The requirement to pay an entrance fee when joining the church was voted out several times only to be voted in again at the next meeting, until it was finally abolished altogether. We can only theorize why these negative practices were utilized. One accommodating policy for guests was the purchase of three hymnals "for use by strangers" in 1873, since church members brought their own hymnals to church. An organ had also been purchased and installed that year.

Trinity continued to share pastors with St. Paul's Church in Menomonee Falls from 1869 to 1883. When Rev. Friedrich Klemme arrived in April 1885, he served both Trinity Church and Friedens Evangelical Church/Peace Memorial in Butler (which eventually merged with St. Paul's E & R Church in Wauwatosa to form Calvary Memorial Church). Trinity shared pastors with Friedens from 1885 to 1928. Trinity had decided to build a parsonage, barn, and well on the south side of the

church building in 1883. The barn and well were finished in 1883, but work on the two-story house, which started in January 1884, was not completed until 1885. The total cost of the house and barn was \$1307.71. A house was rented for the new pastor (Rev. Klemme) while the parsonage was being built. Rev. Klemme's family moved into the house in 1885 (Friedens did not have a parsonage). The first floor of the house consisted of a kitchen, living room, bathroom, pastor's study, and one small bedroom. The second floor of the house consisted of three bedrooms, a small miscellany room, and an attic storage area. There was no basement and no enclosed front porch area.

Other suggestions, please let us know or attend one of the team's meetings.


