

It made me think of how we as the church are challenged to present a safe place for those of our family to enter in. Sometimes we look at our church as a haven, a safe place where we invite others to join us in our exploration of God's love. We hope that all see this as we do and for many this is the case. The hospitality is alive and felt. I believe Trinity UCC has much of this within its life as a community of faith.

We know there have been experiences within religion where our siblings have walked away from the church, feeling as the birds on my back deck have- seeing the dwelling place, but believing they might get hurt. On my deck the birds look to the squirrels, knowing the little tailed beings have access and final say on how safe they will be. The church for some, as they have encountered, can be a place where they are not sure of the welcome within. Maybe we've predetermined what it is that these visitors/spiritual home seekers need and have literally put a sign on the door that says you can enter, but you can't make any changes to the décor or the furnishings (or practices). Don't bring in your own sticks and comforting bedding, because we know what you need. The birdhouses hanging on my fence look pretty where they are and I enjoy looking at them through my kitchen window, but they are just that- for my pleasure, not much use to others.

But then there's the other birdhouse...you know the one that hangs a bit detached from any structure but allows for some "swinging" in the breezes. It is not within my sightline from my kitchen and it is allowed to be used by the inhabitants in their own wonderful way. It is open to be used by whomever wishes to enter it's opening, regardless of what my intention for it is or was.

Creation has a way of reminding us that we need to be open to the newness of what the next is and what/it may need. God in God's beauty of making this wonderful world which we inhabit was given to us freely along with the intention that we learn to adapt as needed. We are to be thankful to our benevolent Creator each time we are allowed to find our home in so many different situations. Each opportunity we have to create love, is another expression of the freedoms we inherited to express and proliferate this embracing of love action so that others can experience God in their own way.

My birdhouses and their placements were what I thought was best, but in the end- my way was not necessarily the home my winged friends needed. I learned from them what God has undoubtably done for me...God has given me the freedom of will and the freedom of love which I can use in making my way through God's world. The key here is to remember and respect that my siblings who all travel with me in this journey through life, are also given the same. Some will make their homes within the church, and some may not- but in the end we all have a home in God's love.

Dear God, I thank you for your trust in me, that I will strive to open my heart to allow you and others in for the making of your kindom here on Earth. Amen




Later he became the son to Pharaoh's daughter, and that's when she named him Moses, which means she got him out of the water.
