







Here are some things I found in an article that may or may not completely explain why our canine friends do such things.

It's not just because they can. In an article written for ABC.Net.AU/news on Aug 2018, Simon Royal brings some great insight, he writes;

"We need to remember that a dog's head is this incredible sensory apparatus," said Professor Daniels, from the University of South Australia.

"They smell so much better than we do, in that their sense of smell is much greater than we have, and they have good vision. Their head is jam-packed full of sensors, so when they stick their head out the window, they've got this great pressure of air moving at great speed over them, and it's a sensory overload."

Professor Daniels said every time a dog stuck its head out of a moving car window, it was evidence of its adventurous and opportunistic nature.

"There's one thing that's really become apparent over the last 20 years about a great many species, and not just mammals, and that is they like to have fun," he said.

"They like joy ... they like great feelings and experiences that make them feel good." **AMEN!** So, what Cheyenne and I witnessed was pure joy, fun and everything that was right there in front of us as we rode along that stretch of Highway.

This reminded me that we too need to make time and room for experiences just like this! What is it in our lives that let's us roll down the windows and stick our joy loving heads and minds out into the world to experience as much joy as God can give us? Do we look forward into the breeze and let the wind blow our cheeks and hair back (Maybe even a little drool C) and allow the sun to find our face? Jacob and Esau


So when Jacob asked Esau for his birthright, Esau should've said, "No way! That's something special for me and I need to use it because every gift I receive is a gift from God."
