

We have a cabin that is out in the Driftless area, a place of hills and streams and rivers, but also beautiful small farms. We love driving through the countryside and our focus again has come to notice the signs of harvest, of farmers in their fields. I'm reminded of an old song, "Bringing in the sheaves, Bringing in the sheaves, We will come rejoicing, Bringing in the sheaves!"



Stewardship typically took place in these small farm communities when the harvest came in. This tradition has long biblical roots begun in the Jewish tradition. Sukkot is the fall holy time. The harvest is meant to be shared not only to take care of the priests and temple, but also to take care of the poor, the weak, the infirm and to provide for their care. Little went to the temple at the beginning. Most of the harvest was meant for the care of others.

We no longer experience harvest time, but rather a paycheck that seems gone before we know it.
