


Out On the Way

Study the issues. Read beyond your favorite cable news. Ask others about their concerns. Encourage your kids and grandkids to claim this important right and duty!


Thank You!

Wearing a mask or face covering can help stop the spread of coronavirus. Thank you for doing your part to keep our staff and other patrons safe!


The Gift of Music . . . And Editing!

Over the Labor Day weekend, the talented musical team of **Mike & Mikey Hetzel** spent two days recording nearly 35 songs that will be used to create Trinity's Sunday morning worship for September and October.

Mike worked with Pastor Susan to create the song list, then more magic happens behind the scenes that you may not notice.

Every week that Trinity offers an online service, Mikey invests an additional 10 hours or so per week to over-dub parts, edit, split/splice, adjust, balance, match, edit the videos with the slideshow, and then finally upload to You-tube. This entire editing process is time intensive and certainly done with love of Trinity in mind. Without Mikey performing these important technical procedures, Trinity would not have had these quality services for the past 5 months. What a blessing for our members!
