"after the comma"

Hello, Trinity United Church of Christ!

I had a thought of finding some really clever opening statement to introduce myself to all of you, but what I kept coming back to was the simple word hello. Then as I so often do, I researched that word..."hello". Seems to me it's been around us for thousands of years, but actually came into our vocabulary in the early 1800's. Its initial use was to attract attention as in hailing a driver, or to express surprise. Ammon Shea writes as author of *The First Telephone Book*: Hello is a new word. The Oxford English Dictionary says the first published use of "hello" goes back only to 1827. And it wasn't mainly a greeting back then. Ammon says people in the 1830's said hello to attract attention ("Hello, what do you think you're doing?"), or to express surprise ("Hello, what have we here?"). Hello, didn't become "hi" until the telephone arrived.

Confessing I didn't know this, I am here to say that my hello to you contains both of these uses. Hello, I am so excited to be here with all of you, and hello, who would have thought to put us together?

I am humbled and ecstatic in the call to be your Pastor. In this time of pandemic, social upheaval, justice concerns and all of our yearning for normalcy, God has done a new thing. God has brought us together to explore, dream, build, sing, work, cry, pray and create a place where love can be given and accepted freely.

Coronavirus (Covid-19) Policy Guidelines

DEFINING DIRECT EXPOSURE is defined as contact with a COVID-19 positive individual within 6 feet for at least 15 minutes in a day, <u>regardless</u> of mask usage or other personal protection equipment. If the result of the test is positive and you develop severe symptoms like: difficulty breathing, bluish lips or face, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, new confusion or trouble staying awake, you should notify your Physician to report symptoms **and** tell them you tested positive for coronavirus. This list is not all-inclusive. Please consult your Physician for any other symptoms that are severe or concerning.

CONTACT TRACING

Anyone that tests Covid-19 positive, suspects they have been exposed to a Covid-19 positive person, exhibits signs & symptoms of Covid-19 will contact the Council President. If reported by another person, Council President will contact the suspected COVID-19 positive individual to identify anyone at Trinity who has had direct exposure to that individual while at a Trinity function. The window for contact tracing for a COVID-19 positive indi-vidual starts at the time the report is received and goes back to 48 hours before the COVID-19 positive individual's symptom onset or to 48 hours prior to a COVID-19 test if the individual was asymptomatic or 48 hours prior to suspected exposure.

NOTIFICATIONS

Council President, in consultations with Pastor, will inform the Congregation at the next in-person Worship Service and will send explanatory letter (US Post Service and MailChimp or other methods) to members and friends listed in the current Church Directory. In addition, emails and phone calls will be made to Trinity Committees or groups and individuals who may have been directly affected.

QUARANTINE

Those identified as having direct exposure are required to quarantine for 14 days from date of exposure, even if they test negative for COVID-19 during that time.

FACILITY CLEANING

If/when a COVID-19 positive individual has been in Trinity, Council President receives notice and restricts access to areas that are potentially impacted. Deep cleaning of the potentially impacted areas is per-formed and all surfaces are disinfected.

Trinity is closed to <u>all members</u> except Pastor, Music Director, Audio Tech Administrator, Office Administrator and B&O Chair, Bookkeeper, Counter, Cleaning Crew, Custodian, Decorating Chair, Property Committee Members for repairs, and Council members, all who are deemed essential to the ongoing work of Trinity United Church of Christ, and anyone directly approved by the Council President or the Pastor.

When can I stop isolation at home?

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), you may discontinue home isolation when:

- You have had no fever for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medication and
- Your symptoms have improved and
- At least fourteen (14) days have passed since symptoms first appeared or at least fourteen (14) days have passed since testing positive and if you didn't experience any symptoms.

If you have an immunocompromising condition as determined by your Physician, please consult your local public health department for additional recommendations.

A mandatory sign in sheet with the date indicated has been placed at the northwest door at Trinity and similar attendance sheets are mandatory for all Trinity related functions. For Trinity related functions, the attendance sheets will need to be submitted to office. If a group has been exposed or a possible exposure, the Council President will refer to the sign in documents to contact people in attendance.

(Sierra is in her last semester at UW Steven's Point with a focus on obtaining a Bachelor's Degree Majoring in both Social Work and Sociology. She intends to work with Hospice counseling. She is employed at the school along with a waitressing job that she loves in town. Buddy is another shelter dog with some Boxer and maybe a bit of terrier...who knows? Has become good friends with Nel when visiting)

Jenna always brings two loud little people with her. They are annoying. They are too busy. She brings my brother Moses (the dog) sometimes and now there is another new crazy dog named Pretzel. She runs fast. (Jenna, Dave, Elliot (5), and Foster (3) are living in Plymouth near the high school. Dave is the Corporate Attorney for Bemis Manufacturing Co. and has retained some space in their home to perform his work virtually. Jenna is busy as a mom and homemaker and part time employed at Mainstream Boutique in Sheboygan. Jenna, Shaun and Dave also (when able) perform as the musical group Sister Winchester all around Eastern WI)

I like Elliot because he drops food when he eats. (Elliot is in Pre K and is loved by his classmates and teachers. He has become quite the dancer and his moves to Michael Jackson songs is something to witness. His creativity goes into making things with as much tape as he can find and loves doing Legos with his Dad.)

I like Foster because he drops food when he eats. (Foster is pure kid. Always moving and a contagious laugh. He enjoys being with his brother, but also can be quite creative in finding ways to entertain us all. He is becoming a very independent thinker and let's you know what is on his mind.)

Shaun doesn't have a dog and she let's me lick her face. She smells like cats. (Shaun is living in Appleton and is working as a Customer Service Specialist for BMO Harris Bank. Her playing with Jenna and Dave in Sister Winchester took a break during the unfortunate pandemic, but she still is writing songs preparing for when they are back out playing. She is engaged to Brian who is a self-employed Marketing and Web Designer and they enjoy spending time with Brian's son Broederick who graduated from H.S. this year and is living in TX. They're learning new things to cook during the "shut down" and are planning a wedding set for Sept 2021. Gibson was correct. Yes, she does have 2 cats, Joplin and Frazier)



I don't like it when she cuts my claws. That makes me crabby. She is always keeping me awake with that tall cleaner thing (vacuum) and the water gurgly spinning thing next to my house (Washer and Dryer). She is always doing stuff, she needs to take more naps like me. (Brenda continues to work part time as an Office Adminstrator at Lakeland Chiropractic. She also gets to spend Grandma time with Elliot and Foster for a few days each week helping to get them to school and daycare when needed. She is a master planner and is skilled at keeping everyone on schedule and in the know.)

You (Dan) let me nap in your office. You let me outside and you throw squeaker toys for me when I ask. I don't like that you don't drop food when you are eating. I know you want to. (No Gibson-I do not want to feed you like that. Others have that covered. This year I graduated with a Master of Divinity Degree from Chicago Theological Seminary, received Authorization of Call from the UCC and am happy to have received and accepted a call to be the settled $\frac{1}{2}$ Time Pastor for Trinity UCC in Brookfield, WI. I begin as their sole Minister February 1^{st} , 2021. I still am happily employed with VTI Security as the WI Branch Manager, working 80% from home and then from our two offices in Menasha and West Allis, WI. Yes, still playing in my classic rock band "Charlie Bucket" and had the joy of recording 30 of our classic songs at a studio in Appleton this last winter. My service with St John's UCC will come to an end in Jan, and I will miss so many, but am looking forward to my new call! Many thanks to all who traveled with me on this journey so far.)

So not sure who is all reading this, but I will say that I am happy that my people are all healthy and able to take care of me. I haven't seen as many of you around this year, but I have heard there was something to do about keeping distance. I do that all the time. (Yes, he likes to keep to himself through out the day). I do miss seeing all of my peoples, but when I do see you, I'll make sure I wag my tail extra hard and show how happy I am that you are here. (I agree with Gibson on this, but I won't wag my tail...you'll just have to imagine that.) I am thankful for all that is given to me. Each moment I am surprised when you take time to talk or walk with me or even pat me on the head. I guess I am truly a blessed dog. I'll be even more blessed when you drop a piece of bacon on the floor. That is my favorite. Oh and tell Nel to stop smelling my butt.

Yes- God has truly blessed us and we look to the days forward with renewed joy and hope. This has been one of the most challenging years with schedule changes, separation, life events being very different and trying. If we learned a new term this year it was definitely "virtual"! Our love for all of you is not virtual but, in our hearts, as we pray the coming year will bring us all new opportunities to be together. Each of you are celebrated and loved!

Can we go for a walk now? Those squirrels on the porch are laughing at me again. (Yes Gibson.)
