





IMPORTANT RECYCLING UPDATE

Many thanks to all for the aluminum and tin cans that you bring to Trinity as you recycle to protect the environment. The price per pound for these items is the highest I have seen.

Remember that aluminum cans and tin cans must be separated. Also, the cans should be empty of fluids. No plastic bottles.

A special concern that I need to request as per the company that purchases the cans is this:

If you have aluminum or metal items such as single-use aluminum cooking pans, foil, or small scrap metal items they MUST be placed in a separate bag – not mixed with any of the cans.

Simply place these items in an old plastic bag and set next to the large containers in the recycling area at the back of the church.

All this makes me wonder and think about how fragile our time is here on Earth. God has given us much, but it is given with a knowledge that things will change. We also understand that while we are given this time, we are a part of the whole of creation in whatever manner we choose. Within this time, we are also connected to others and the will they bring. We are asked to be moved by what we experience, and it is within connection that we create community.

The Elm tree at one time (probably eighty or more years ago) was just a sapling beginning from the forest floor, stretching as best as it could to gain light, rain and ground. Upon reaching a certain size, the Elm you could imagine understood that it was to be a part of the larger forest around it. Then the world came crashing in. A house was built within 40 feet or so using the Elms lofty arms for additional shade and beauty to adorn this new dwelling for a family. From there the years go on and the growth of the Elm and its cousins the Basswoods along with some Maple and Oak trees is constant as this is the plan of the Creator. During their time of growing and living, I can imagine they were climbed by children, squirrels and raccoons. Birds perched themselves in order to rest and watch. Even the branches that fell and scattered about the yard from these giants, became sticks for playing with by kids and some neighborhood dogs. Was there ever a waste of their lives? Was there angst about how much or little was being done? We have much to learn from God's creation. There is living amongst the trees that for so long have watched the neighborhood churn and morph and through it all, the seasons have added to their story. I could go on and on in describing the wonderment of nature and how we are all so connected, and in the end, the truth of what we know will be on display.

In this Easter Season which is coming upon us, we are reminded of how we are given the gift of life. This is not just for us to live by, but where our hope is. Christ turns our fear of the next into the intentional ever-present love of our God. Love is where all of creation goes to thrive, to experience this love is to also help us when the storms blow our limbs around. We know the pains of losing, of being left behind, of being hurt. Our branches once firmly attached and strong, becoming frail and cracked. Ours is not a life known only for lament, but it is a life celebrated by our living of love.

Neil Peart the lyricist of "The Trees" was asked a few years after the song "The Trees" had become popular, what was the message within the song? He said none. He is quoted to say. "No. It was just a flash. I was working on an entirely different thing when I saw a cartoon picture of these trees carrying on like fools. I thought, 'What if trees acted like people?' So I saw it as a cartoon really, and wrote it that way. I think that's the image that it conjures up to a listener or a reader. A very simple statement." (April/May 1980 Modern Drummer).

So maybe I am putting a face on these trees in my front yard and imagining them to have knowledge. Knowledge of some part of the mystery of life, love and God. For this, I am sad that I will be bringing them back down to where it all began. Our Biblical history as God's children highlights how the Trees have been with us all along as fellow servants. The Tree in the Garden of Eden, the beams for Noah's Ark, the burning bush for Moses, the fig tree in Jesus's Parable, the Cedars of Lebanon, and the Olive Trees silently listening in the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed the night before his crucifixion...and the tree of the Cross.

Maybe these trees aren't so distant after all from us in God's world. In God's magnificent creation, we are much like the seeds that these trees have scattered about, wanting only for more creation, growth and love to carry us on. Our Easter experience rejoices in another season of God's love for all of creation, and our reminder is when we see the first leaves blossom on the trees.

Christ is Risen! Christ is risen indeed! Love is given! Love is given indeed!


