

Sure, we know what colors the autumn leaves will be in the tress of our yard and neighborhood, but I swear each year I find leaves that have come from far away to mix in with them. Their colors, beauty and mass are combined with those that have fallen before and it is a cornucopia of a leafy harvest!

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 was put into song beginning back in 1959 by Pete Seeger. It was a song he whipped together to appease his publisher at the time and was supposed to be a move beyond his protest songs from recent years. Seeger took the words directly from the Bible, added "turn, turn, turn," and ended the song with "a time of peace, I swear it's not too late." The publisher responded, "well that's more like it!". (Funny sounds like the making of a protest song to me.) Then in 1965, the Byrds produced their more well-known version. I love the write up I found about this song in Financial Times and came from an article written about "Life of a Song, Vol 2" edited by David Cheal and Jan Dalley. They wrote;

"The song reached number one in the US in December of 1965. That year, American ground troops arrived in Vietnam, men on campuses burned their draft cards, black civil rights activists withstood fire hoses and police dogs, and President Lyndon Johnson promoted his 'great society' reforms. A chorus of shaggy-haired young men pressed the nation to 'turn, turn' turn' and accept the change that is inevitable, history is a cycle, strife is temporary, and to everything there is a season."

Seems like some of this could be pulled from our current news headlines doesn't it?

It is true that change is inevitable and we in the church are not immune to it. We are blessed to have so many good things within the history, life and living of our communities. We can embrace change in a way that says, we have been here before. What keeps us coming back is love, love, love! In fact – that is the one constant that holds us in faith, hope and joy. Knowing that whatever change must occur, it is in response (or should be!) to our abundance of love from God. We are in the time that is with and calling us to respond. All of the wisdom put into this verse from Ecclesiastes should resonate with our lives as it really cannot be separated from who and whose we are.

I know I will have plenty of this year's leaves to rake up and place into piles. These leaves were purposeful in their living. Now I will wait until the next inevitable Spring, where the dreams and life of another season will be awakened and once gain life will turn...and it's not too late for peace.

May God's love be with us all in this season of Fall and change in preparation for the next. Amen.

Trinity Treats!! Apple Cider Doughnut Cake

For the Cake:

- Yellow cake mix I used Betty Crocker Yellow Super Moist
- ¾ cup apple cider NOT apple juice
- ¼ cup water Room Temperature. Note: If you want a stronger apple cider taste, omit the water and use one full cup of apple cider
- ½ cup apple sauce we used cinnamon apple sauce, not chunky
- 3 large eggs room temperature
- 1/4 tsp cinnamon more if you like it really cinnamony!
- 1 tbsp brown sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla

For the Cinnamon Sugar Topping

- 2 tablespoons cinnamon depending on how much cinnamon you prefer
- ¼ cup sugar
- 1/4 cup melted butter

For the Dipping Glaze

- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1/4 cup apple cider




