# Replacements

I was visiting recently with a cousin of mine and it was the first visit I had with her since she had knee replacement surgery. Now I've been very fortunate in my life to not have had to go through this style of surgery and it was a time for me to ask some questions about what she had experienced. Of course, the first question was how are you doing? I could see that her ability to walk was a bit of a challenge but knowing her- this was just a challenge that she was ready to take on. Talking with her mother- (she against her doctors and therapists' recommendations) had gone back to work almost 6 weeks early. (By the way her mother has had both knees replaced also!) As she shook off our gasps of why you would risk going back so early - she began describing how it felt...this new part of her body. Researching the recovery, it says it can take up to a Year and sometimes a bit longer for the full recovery from this style of surgery. I would imagine knee, hip elbow replacements would have similar time frames. Yes, pain replaced with a new prosthetic within ones body can be guite an experience and takes much work by skilled surgeons, nursing care, therapy and the want of the patient to do what is needed to bring mobility without pain to fruition. It's not easy and again, not having gone through it myself, I can only imagine.

But then my cousin brought up something that was intriguing and filled my mind with considerations I had not thought about before.

She was experiencing the feeling of something new, foreign in her body and this feeling was of what is this new thing- will it ever be accepted by the host limbs and tissue and most of all will it survive and become one with the whole?



I found this on Curovate.com... "Many people with a knee replacement have a difficult time accepting their newly replaced knee as a normal part of their body. Accepting their new knee and having a good relationship with it is a very important aspect of recovery that is often overlooked.<sup>[3]</sup> Rather than just focusing on physical function, healthcare professionals are beginning to recognize the importance of understanding people's feelings and perceptions toward their new knee."

Yes she had a feeling of something being of help, but also of having a high degree of keeping her on notice of the change to her body...was there full trust in this new joints capabilities? Would it hold up when called upon to do strenuous things as the former joint had allowed before it became too painful and worn down? Not any questions that I could answer and for my cousin probably too soon to know as well.

It made me think of how we look at this time of Advent. We have had a year previous where we worked through the seasons, worked through what we had been asked to do and some was of joy, some of pain and sadness, some of war and some of new life. And now we get the chance again to bring in the newness of God's gift. God's transplant and replacement of the worn wants and ways of our human lives. Reattaching us to the love giving hope, joy and peace which Christ brings to our bodies of faith. God as surgeon has given us the procedure for finding love again when our world has caused us to move in pain with the extra weight of hate, prejudice and mistrust. Jesus comes in as a new way, a regenerative part of our spiritual bodies, but now we must do the work of receiving and recovering once again. Our prayers answered.

Just like my cousins new knee joint, we notice a newness within us...and if we truly believe in the power of love that our God bestow to our aching hearts and souls, we will begin to work through the exercises...strengthening our fledgling new love joints and limbs.

#### And you can hear Jesus right next to us saying "keep going...you've got this and I'm right here".

The best part of all of this- is knowing all the world is given this same opportunity, this same surgery of the soul where we can find common ground. It takes our attention and our will to accept this love and give it as freely as it is given to us. Yes, accepting the replacement to our broken hopes, our fears and doubts with the new love moving joint woven onto our own limbs of life!

Hallelujah to the God Most High who knows how much we need Christ in our lives...it is the Way in which we live that can help all God's children recover and renew for we have many more loves to do. May you find Hope, Joy, Peace and Love this Advent season. Amen

# Gideon – part 2

God had something a little different in mind. He told Gideon he had too many men in his army. He knew that Israel would think they defeated the Midianites on their own without God's help.

So God said to Gideon, "Announce to the people, 'Anyone whose afraid may go home now'." Amazingly twenty-two thousand of the men left! That's a lot of people! More than half of the whole army went home. Only ten thousand stayed.

Gideon still felt alright. At least they had ten thousand men, right? Not for long. The Lord told Gideon he still had too many men.

When they went down to the water for a drink the Lord told him, "Separate the men that drink the water like a dog and the ones that get on their knees and drink from their cupped hands."

I'm thinking this took quite a while with all those men but Gideon did it. It's surprising, but only three hundred men got on their knees and drank from their hands. All the rest looked silly drinking like dogs!

God told Gideon that he only wanted the three hundred men and the rest were supposed to go home. This way when they won, the Israelites would know that God was in control with only three hundred men left.

Gideon didn't know how God was going to help them win. There were so many Midianites against just three hundred of them so he worried and wasn't getting any sleep. So, God decided to help Gideon and make him feel better about things.

During the night the Lord spoke to Gideon, "If you are still afraid that I'm going to help you win, go down in the valley with your servant Purah where the Midianites are staying and listen to what they're saying. You'll feel much better after that."

Guess what Gideon did? He was still afraid and took Purah and snuck down to the Midinaite camp. Just as he arrived he heard one of them talking to his friend about a dream he had. He was saying, "I dreamt that a round loaf of bread came rolling into our camp. It came so fast that it ran right into one of our tents and made it fall over."

His friend responded, "This must mean the sword of Gideon and that God will help him defeat the Midianites."

As soon as Gideon heard this he worshiped God and ran back to the camp. He returned and called out, "Get up, the Lord has given us the Midianite camp!"



He divided all the men in three groups and gave them all trumpets and empty jars with torches inside.

Gideon and the men surrounded the camp in the three groups (remember they were up high looking down into the valley). When Gideon started to blow his trumpet the rest followed.

They blew their trumpets and yelled, "For the Lord and for Gideon!" Then they broke the jars they were carrying, holding onto the torches with one hand and the trumpet in the other hand shouting, "A sword for the Lord and for Gideon!"

When the Midianites heard this they started yelling and running around. Then when all the trumpets started again the Lord caused the Midianites to start freaking out and they started to turn on each other with their swords.

The rest that got away were captured by the men of Ephraim by the Jordan because Gideon sent messengers ahead of them to let them know they were coming.

That was the day God saved Gideon and defeated the Midianites. Without God none of this was possible. I hope that after this Gideon learned his lesson and stopped worrying. With God nothing is impossible!


Next time you're in a tough situation know that God can give you strength and he wants to help you. Just ask and He will!
