

A Sunday Morning Church Bread Recipe!

1. Gathering everything that you need to make the loaf.

We as God's children come together from all walks of life, ready to bring our ingredients of self into the mix.

2. Measuring the ingredients

We find our place within the Sanctuary and gathering spaces as we join together making room for all, trying not to take too much and leaving room for others. We welcome each and all. (We even make room at the pews!!)

3. Mixing the dough to the right consistency

We begin talking, greeting, welcoming and moving around the space mixing our lives and experiences.

4. Resting and stretching & folding or kneading the dough

As we begin our Worship, we open our hearts- resting our thoughts and prepare ourselves through prayer and common speaking. We stretch our minds and knead our souls.

5. First rise/ fermentation/ proof

We receive the Word of Scripture. It begins to ferment in our thoughts, giving us glimpses of our ancestors and how they found the world with voices of the past challenging us to look further and grow.

6. **Deflating** (gently) & **dividing** (if you are making more than one loaf)
We pray together. We acknowledge the presence of Love and the ways in which have embraced Love and the ways we have not loved. We search both our individual and common ways where we have been the true disciples we strive to be and pray to the One who brings us back for trying again...

7. Shaping

We begin to hear a message...a call which begins to have us ready for what will form us next...how we can be prepared for love and living within the Way.

8. Second rise / proofing / secondary fermentation

We allow for relaxation of singing together, hearing sounds of music and common prayer. We sing in parts and verses knowing that we are but one of the whole with the melody of love as our guide through each song of life. We challenge and "knead" each other through this process.

9. Pre-heating and preparing the oven

We come together as church to receive the gifts of the Eucharist- being together at the table knowing each needs to be fed in the sharing of love for all who believe and have Faith in our God's loving forgiveness and mercy.

10. Slashing/ scoring the loaf with a sharp knife or razor

We commit to each other and our God moving into the world with a voice proclaiming the Good News of God's Love for all. We know it will be difficult and will open up ourselves to more heat within the lines of the world's judgement, but we are ready and knowing that we will have scars from loving that will increase our beauty and common bond.

11. Baking (and steaming the oven)

Yes, it will get hot in here (or out there) when we truly give of ourselves to each other and the proclaiming of a God who embraces all. Each of our lives will grow and expand as we are kindled in the warmth of common Love as we all take on the "crust" of the world trying to harden us.

12. Cooling

In this stage allow for others to tell their stories as we listen...listen and allow ourselves to hear and take on the temperature of the world around us.

13. Eating

The culmination is when we have been ready for our lives to be taken in through love. Flavorful in our differences, but common in our gift to the world. Jesus Christ was the Bread of Life, and we are the continuation of His Friendship "starter" with all the ingredients started and looking for us to add our flour. We create and carryout another "loaf" from which we and those around us can be nourished and given more life of love to live.

So maybe I am not a baker. But I can tell you that I am a lover of the Bread of life we all are. Now how do I create a metaphor for the butter and jelly that compliments each of these slices...that's for another time/writing...

Dear God- thank you for the ingredients of our lives given to us by your everlasting pantry. May we become the bakers of the Loaves of Love, willing to supply our neighbors with what they need to be filled. Amen

The Lord called Samuel a third time, and Samuel got up and went to Eli again and said, "Here I am; you called me."




