

Happy New Year kids! Last month your story was about Mary and Joseph and their baby Jesus. After Jesus was born he was visited by Kings or sometimes called Wise Men. This month's story is about the Wise Men that found Jesus.



The Wise Men


They were safe in Egypt, and after King Herod died an angel appeared to Joseph and told him he could go to a place called Nazareth. And that is where Jesus grew up.




Winter Crossword
