

I looked down the center aisle and saw many more people coming down the center just as I had done a few minutes before and trying to do the math it seemed like there were more people than seats left. At this point I began again wondering who would take the center seat between me and the father of the family surrounding me.

At this point a younger couple had made they way to our section and from the look in their eyes, they had decided on the seats that were open in our row. The young lady took a seat on the other side of our row in the aisle and the young man took his position in the middle seat next to me. A quick glance between us let the other know that it was a fine choice and would be a safe seat. No words, but the communication of body language and knowing that there were not many other options for seating created a welcoming space for us to be in. We were on a journey together, not planned with this seating arrangement, but going in the same direction nonetheless.

Our flight took off and it was just as the sun was setting with an overcast sky...but it was amazing to break above the clouds and see the world above. God's glory from different vantage points and it was all good! After we leveled out and I was able to use my tray in front of me, I began to read my book. The kids in front of me were sharing a small smartphone between themselves and they giggled as they watched the Grinch movie. The dad I could see was also watching an in-flight movie and he had chosen the "Barbie" movie. I was amused of his movie selection, but seeing as I had just seen the movie a week prior- knew he would enjoy it. The young man next to me had placed full ear headphones on and then proceeded to place his head down in his arms with the seat tray supporting his effort to take some rest.

As the flight went along, At first, I couldn't believe it. I could tell my seat friend had fallen asleep and now his frame and arm were leaning into me. At first, my thought was "Hey- this is my space...I need you to get back on your side of the seat...(as you know most airline seats nowadays are pretty tight on space and elbow room to begin with). I contemplated nudging him awake to express my need for my space, but then I reconsidered. Sure, I wanted more of my own space, but my fellow traveler just needed some rest and in a safe place. I could handle this for a while, couldn't I? It made me think of how when Christ was born, how those who had been asked maybe could have made room at the Inn, maybe even given up a couch or something. There was room, but it was within the makeshift location of a barn that held the invitation to rest and be. The reply of the animals you could imagine were of- "hey, this is our space...maybe you should move on", but in response they embraced and accepted the fellow travelers in their midst. They understood that the barn was a home for all to be and that it was equal in its shelter and invitation to those who entered it. Yes, we should be so invitational in our own living and journeying.

So, I let my seat friend sleep for a while. Someday, I'm sure, I will need the same.

God thank you for giving us the space within our hearts to be open so that we may be shelter for others. Let us make room for the love of Christ so that others may feel safe and loved as you have taught us. Amen



We spent approximately 1 hour and a half looking at ornaments, District 56 Villages, Jim Shore Santas and Fontanini nativity scenes. Everyone had a good time and spent on gifts for family and friends. After this, we drove in two cars to Sawmill Inn in Richfield for lunch, which again was a big hit with the ladies. We arrived back in Brookfield at around 3 with all having a good time and agreeing that this was a great way to start the holiday season.

On Saturday, of that same week the ladies came together to set up the Dining Hall for the Annual Christmas Tea in Memory of Roland Perschon that was held the next day after Worship. Each table was decorated in either red or green tablecloths with red candles set in greenery The two main tables were decked out with red, green and plaid tablecloths overlayed with a lace runner.
