"after the comma" The Recipe



(Noun) A set of instructions for preparing a particular dish, including a list of the ingredients required.

Similar: Something which is likely to lead to a particular outcome.

So true! A recipe when followed, can create what the originator of the recipe (in this case lets talk about a food dish) wanted the preparer to know, to learn, and to experience. It literally is a transference of one's thoughts about a food dish to be related and replicated to another. Another thing to remember is does the reader/preparer like the actual ingredients and is excited about the potential food outcome that will happen? Both the originator of the recipe and the preparer will need to agree on at least that. You wouldn't try a recipe for Liver and Onions if you did not like Liver...I'm just guessing on that... So

When I have had the opportunity to have a meal with friends or family, there have been many times where a new dish has been tried. There are some that truthfully are good, but not enough that I would ask for the recipe. You've probably been there too. Then there are those times when you are amazed at what is presented to you on the plate, and the flavors come together singing their appeals to your taste buds and you tell yourself-I need to know how to do that! Even a restaurant becomes inspiration and you ask the server to see if you could get the chef's recipe for the sauce or the fantastic rice pilaf that accompanied the main course.

Yes so many variations and so much experimentation. For me the recipes after I've read through them also give me inspiration to use some of my own ideas and changes even within the recipe, while learning the original concept and using it's ideas in context of my guest or even my own likes/dislikes. For me the recipe becomes the building block of what I will do next.

If you are still following my metaphor, here is where I tie this together with the Bibles adorning my bookcases and desks. They do the same!

God through God's infinite ability to inspire and love us, gave to us so many voices. Voices of our ancestor trying to find God, using recipes handed down, and then living them into the next context. Remember that second definition of recipe, here it is again;

Something which is likely to lead to a particular outcome.

Wouldn't you agree that the recipes of love and life found in the Gospels and the Epistles literally are recipes from the grand life chef, Jesus Christ? We have tasted the outcome at some point in our lives, we have eaten of the compassion, love and grace ladled out to us by our God, and we want more, in fact we want to know how to give this wonderful meal to others. Well, we have the recipe book...The Bible! The version of the Book doesn't as much matter as does the actual inspiration and trying of the recipes found within the many pages by those who read of it. The outcome of the God recipe is the building of God's kin-dom...heaven on Earth!

We have a world of opportunities and people wanting to know this recipe and they are waiting for us to make it in our own style, but also being true to the One who originated the first recipe. It is the very same equation that we use so many times in worship...God= Love. So I'll give a go to list out the ingredients for a simple starter recipe. The trick to this recipe is that the ingredient amounts are up to each of us as we are able...here it is...

God's Kin-dom Recipe Ingredient List; Love, Embracing, Hearing, Compassion, Empathy, Sympathy, Grace, Forgiveness, Attention And don't forget- you can never have too much love in this recipe...use liberally. Ad whatever caring spices of life that you feel will create a grander dish and you and your guests will not be disappointed.

Then Jesus the Master Chef tells us to mix this all together making sure that what we are striving for is what we would also want...Love God, Love others. Put it all into a dish and serve warmly to all you meet.

Let's cook together...Dinner is served and all are welcome to the table!

The Story of Moses and the Pharaoh


