

I believe we use our knowledge of time to mark our view and existence within our world. Everything from birthdates to anniversaries, punching a time card, turning a calendar page or even setting the time on our oven as we bake bread or cook our meals. Time has a value doesn't it? For some things in our lives the shorter the time the better as when we are anxious, hungry or in pain. This is balanced with the longer the time when we are at peace, happy or feeling loved. These timeframes are all important and, in many ways, allow us to find where we are in God's creation.

Our animal friends literally do not tell time, but I believe they "feel" time. They listen to their bodies, are exposed to the movement of sun and moon. They know when they are needing to move into an awake position, or when to move towards feeding activities or whatever creation is calling them to do. I do not recall ever having heard one of our dogs or cats calling out to their young ones to come in because it's dinner time at a specific hour and minute. I believe it was done more from where they were at. The little fledgling birds in the robin's nest outside my garage I swear are thinking feeding time is actually their awake time...that poor mother bird is constantly in a feeding mode!

This brings me to my initial observation about my want of sleeping in. For some they may look at the ability to be awakened, but then have the capacity to fall back to sleep as a luxury. I would agree. My fortunate position in life and society does allow for me the facility to have this kind of extra time control to arise. I do feel guilty on many occasions to have this blessing of "control" of time. My wife Brenda is constantly challenging me on this as once she is awake...she is up for the day... (don't know how that feels myself...  $\mathfrak{S}$ )

But here is where I am going with all of this.

We are asked to be awake. Awake to what God's time is for us. This awake time may happen at the break of dawn or may happen as the rooster crows in a neighbors back yard. It may happen when an early morning storm stretches overhead, or the warming sun glows in from curtains left open. It may literally jump in on us as a child bouncing on the foot of our bed inviting us to rise and shine! It may happen later in the day as we have arisen, but then are wakened to what is around us. The needs of others, the call of a loved one who is asking for our attention or the other in our midst literally begging for the chance of peaceful sleep as in *Proverbs 3:24; "When you lie down, you will not be afraid; when you lie down, your sleep will be sweet."* 

For many of our brothers and sisters, siblings in the family of God (Love), sleep comes at a high price. It means they are not using their available time to satisfy their bodily hunger or the attainment of a safe place or situation for themselves or their families. This thirst for justice and peace when their days are filled with turmoil, rejection and need for connection becomes the daily work that consumes and does not let them fully rest. Sleep comes at a cost. *Philippians 4:6-7 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."* It's hard to let go and just sleep when so much needs to be done just to live...Psalm 3:5 "I lie down and sleep; I wake again, because the LORD sustains me".

In our ability to be alert to those who need rest, we can literally create peace in small and wonderous ways by giving of ourselves to the beds and pillows of time, talent and monies to support the weary. We know who these are in our lives and society. We just need to refrain from hitting the "snooze button" and rise and shine with the love, grace and forgiveness which God literally did for us in the life, Love, teaching and rising of God's own in Jesus Christ! If Christ was willing to do this for us, who are we as His followers to not do and teach the same?

For us, we can do our best to live into the new morning, the new opportunity that is given each and every day. Thanking God for all God has given...and for this abundant time we have been blessed with to give, to give to others so they may experience the same.

Know that you are blessed and loved with the time and love of God which is promised to be everlasting! Amen!


So Moses put his sandals back on and made sure to take his staff of God, and went to get his wife and children to go to free the Israelites.
