

In Scripture we find a curious answer that Jesus gave to the powerful and those wanting to follow him. Matthew 8:19-20 (NIV)

<sup>19</sup> Then a teacher of the law came to him and said, "Teacher, I will follow you wherever you go."

<sup>20</sup> Jesus replied, "Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head."

# David and Goliath – Part 1

Meanwhile Saul was still king and he ruled people called Israelites. David and his family were Israelites too. The Israelites weren't getting along with people named the Philistines.


